CONSTRUCTION UPDATE & RETURN TO RIVER WEST

The construction of the new River West property is moving fast! The first phase units are scheduled to be complete and ready for leasing out to residents in late January/early February 2021. Progress photos are to the right.

Demolition for phase one began in December 2019 and the construction for phase one encompasses 74 housing units. including 37 replacement units, 16 tax credit units and 21 market rate units. All units will come with washer and dryers in units, are pre-wired for internet access and include a security system and access to a tornado shelter.

Residents from Riverview Parks that moved out as part of phase one (move out date prior to August 2019) will have an opportunity to move into the new units first.

If you are interested in returning to the new River West property, please make sure to reach out to your case manager and stay in contact with them throughout the Choice Tulsa project (contact info inside the newsletter). You also need to continue to stay in good standing - so stay up-to-date on paying rent and utilities.

URBAN STRATEGIES - FAMILY SUPPORT

Urban Strategies provides guidance and resources for you and your family to help reach your goals services related to education and career, health & wellness and other social services. We are here to **help you.** Please work closely with your case manager from Urban Strategies so they can help with any needs you have and help your household be prepared for changes.

If you are having trouble paying rent or utilities, let your case manager know so we can help get **your balances paid off.** Your case manager can also help connect you with other basic needs such as food, cleaning supplies, household items and educational resources. You must remain in good standing now and in the future to keep your assistance and to return to the new River West community. If you do not remain in good standing, you will no longer be eligible for services provided by the relocation coordinators and Urban Strategies' team. Staying in good standing means paying your rent and utilities on time, not getting evicted, and reporting income/household changes.

If you change your number or have a new phone number, please reach out to your case manager **ASAP.** Contact info for case managers is below. Not sure who your case manager is? Contact Angie Fent at 918-712-0840 and she can help connect you.

MR. MYKEY'S CORNER: EDUCATION UPDATE FROM YOUR EDUCATION SPECIALIST

School looks different this year, and we are here to help you navigate it! You can visit www.tulsaschools.org/parents to find resources including a video library with virtual platform tutorials, parent guide, and other parent resources to support distance learning. If you have guestions about your child's daily schedule please contact your child's teacher, school-site front office team, or parent facilitator. For high school students, you can reach out to their counselor or me at 918 508-3816.



While Tulsa Public Schools is in distance learning, attendance will be based on students logging into Canvas and doing their assignments. Elementary students will need to complete a minimum of 10 assignments per week in a week with no holidays and secondary students will need to complete a minimum of 5 assignments per week per course in a week with no holidays.



All Tulsa children under 18 years old can get breakfast, lunch, and dinner meals free of **charge.** Meal service is provided daily from Monday through Friday. Families can pick up meals from 60 sites from 7 to 9 a.m. and from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on weekdays and from Mobile Meals bus stops between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. Parents who bring their children to meal sites do not need to provide ID. Find ID requirements and meal sites at www.tulsaschools.org/mealsites.

GET OUT THE VOTE - VOTE ON NOV.3

We have an upcoming election on Nov. 3. Elections have consequences. Our elected officials decide who pays how much in taxes, what our taxes pay for, what kind of education our children get, what counts as a crime, the minimum wage, who is eligible for Medicaid, SNAP, and WIC benefits, and so much more. Your **vote matters** in helping to decide the election and who makes these important decisions.

- Register to vote in Tulsa by October 9, 2020 for this election
- Update your residence address
- Request an absentee ballot by October 25, 2020 for this election
- View your polling place
- View your upcoming Nov. 3 ballot to know what you'll be voting on
- Research and decide who you want to vote for
